Board Examination Results 2025: A Testament to Excellence

We are proud to share the outstanding performance of our students in the 2025 Board examinations.

In Class XII, all **85** students who appeared for the examination secured Distinction, reflecting an outstanding 100% result. Among them, **27 students scored a perfect Centum**, **59 students scored above 90%**, and **18 students achieved Full A1** in all subjects.
